SUMMER READING PROGRAM LAUDS COMMUNITY: "ALL TOGETHER NOW"



Hmmm... maybe I'll become a fireman someday!

Firemen, policemen, engineers, bicycle repair experts, and budding rock stars all chipped in to make this year's Summer Reading Program (SRP) a resounding success. Although the main goal of the SRP is to curtail summer reading loss among school-age children, the program encourages Garden City community members of all ages to read and learn throughout the summer. The program offers prizes to adults, teens, children and even babies (and their parents) for reaching benchmark reading goals and provides engaging activities for every age group all summer. A total of 2,050 patrons registered for this year's program, which is an increase of 210 over last year's participation, and 767 reached their highest reading benchmarks in the respective categories, an increase of almost 90 over last year's number. Readers were rewarded with rubber duckies, gum balls, toys, ice cream, popcorn, and raffle tickets for major prizes like bikes, Roaring Springs tickets, scooters, drone kits, and Amazon Fire tablets. Of course, the best prizes of all were books! The summer culminated with a big party to celebrate reaching Community Reading Goals. Of the many successes this year's SRP produced, Programs and Outreach Librarian Berardinelli commented that she and the library staff are most proud of "the gains in participation and especially teen participation." The SRP is just one, albeit one of the most significant, programs funded by the Garden City Public Library Foundation. WHERE DOES IT COME FROM CONTINUED

Who funds these programs? The Garden City Public Library Foundation! The GCPL Foundation funds almost 20% of the Library's budget, excluding payroll.
