"UNIVERSE OF STORIES" CONTINUED

The program officially ends on August 1 with a drawing for prizes including passes to Roaring Springs, bicycles, long boards, and, of course, books. Children and families register during the kick-off or any time in June or July and get busy reading. Children are encouraged to read 10 books over the course of the Summer (6 for teens).

The goal of the Summer Reading Program is to help prevent the 'Summer Slide' – children losing reading ability over the Summer. 'Summer Slide' is a problem for all kids, but is especially serious in neighborhoods where parents may struggle to support their children in reading or other academics. Some parents may be working extra hours just to keep food on the table or may be academically challenged themselves. The Summer Reading Program at Garden City Public Library helps all children achieve their potential.

The Program is built on levels (numbers of books read toward their total) to keep children and families engaged. Every time a child completes a level, they come in to the Library for a small prize. If they reach their final reading level of 10 books, they are entered in a drawing for big prizes at the conclusion of the Program. Kids who read more than 10 books get multiple chances in the drawing.

This wonderful program is the brainchild of Amanda Berardinelli and Rachel Worthington (see photo), two of the very special staff members at the Garden City Public Library. Amanda has been with our library for 7 months and came to us from the library in Meridian. She is a BSU graduate with a degree in English and Communications. Her co-worker Rachel describes Amanda as "a gogetter who is passionate about helping others." Amanda also has a "perfect" dog – Reggie – who really should be the official Garden City Public Library Dog! Rachel is an Idaho native, and has worked at our library for 2 years. Rachel's degree is in Multi-Ethnic Studies. Her friend and co-worker Amanda describes Rachel as "absolutely passionate about helping our littlest patrons and their families with early literacy." How lucky for all of us in Garden City that these two women are so passionate about helping our children learn.
